

Memorial service set for Studebaker

Memorial services for Ted Alan Studebaker will be held Monday at 7 p.m. at the West Milton Church of the Brethren.

Studebaker, 25, was killed on April 26 by enemy action in Vietnam where he was serving as a volunteer agriculturist for the Church World Service.

He was a graduate of Milton-Union High School and Manchester College, and received his master's degree at Florida State University.

He is survived by his wife, the former Miss Lee Van Pak, to whom he was married on April 17, 1971; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Stanley Studebaker, Union; four brothers,

Doug, at home, Lowell, of Union, Ron, of Cheshire, Conn., and Gary, of Chino, Calif.; and three sisters, Mrs. Mary Ann Mishler, of Troy, Mrs. Nancy Smith, of Troy, and Mrs. Linda Biller, of Charleston, W. Va.

Studebaker's body is expected to be returned sometime this weekend and funeral arrangements will be handled by the Hale-Sarver Funeral Home.

There will be no visitation and the family has requested that in lieu of flowers, contributions be made to the Ted Studebaker Memorial for Peace and Reconciliation in Vietnam. Contributions may be sent in care of the Church of the Brethren, West Milton.
